#### 1 Thessalonians 2:1-8

<sup>1</sup>You yourselves know, brothers and sisters, that our coming to you was not in vain,

<sup>2</sup>but though we had already suffered and been shamefully mistreated at Philippi, as you know, we had courage in our God to declare to you the gospel of God in spite of great opposition.

<sup>3</sup>For our appeal does not spring from deceit or impure motives or trickery,

# The Gospel - Matthew 22:34-46

Hear the gospel of our Lord Jesus Christ according to Matthew

## All: Glory to you O Lord

<sup>34</sup>When the Pharisees heard that he had silenced the Sadducees, they gathered together,

<sup>35</sup>and one of them, a lawyer, asked him a question to test him. <sup>36</sup>Teacher, which commandment in the law is the greatest?'

<sup>37</sup>He said to him, "You shall love the Lord your God with all your heart, and with all your soul, and with all your mind."

<sup>38</sup>This is the greatest and first commandment.

<sup>39</sup>And a second is like it: "You shall love your neighbour as yourself." <sup>40</sup>On these two commandments hang all the law and the prophets.' <sup>41</sup>Now while the Pharisees were gathered together, Jesus asked them this question:

<sup>42</sup> What do you think of the Messiah? Whose son is he?' They said to him, 'The son of David.'

<sup>43</sup>He said to them, 'How is it then that David by the Spirit calls him Lord, saying,

44"The Lord said to my Lord,

'Sit at my right hand, until I put your enemies under your feet'"?

<sup>45</sup>If David thus calls him Lord, how can he be his son?'

<sup>46</sup>No one was able to give him an answer, nor from that day did anyone dare to ask him any more questions.

#### Sermon

#### Creed

All: We believe in one God, the Father, the Almighty, maker of heaven and earth, of all that is, seen and unseen.

We believe in one Lord, Jesus Christ, the only Son of God, eternally begotten of the Father, God from God, Light from Light, true God from true God, begotten, not made, of one Being with the Father; through him all things were made.

Priest Accept our praises, heavenly Father,
through your Son our Saviour Jesus Christ,
and as we follow his example and obey his command,
grant that by the power of your Holy Spirit
these gifts of bread and wine
may be to us his body and his blood;

who in the same night that he was betrayed, took bread and gave you thanks; he broke it and gave it to his disciples, saying: Take, eat; this is my body which is given for you; do this in remembrance of me.

In the same way, after supper he took the cup and gave you thanks; he gave it to them, saying:
Drink this, all of you; this is my blood of the new covenant, which is shed for you and for many for the forgiveness of sins. Do this, as often as you drink it, in remembrance of me.

Therefore, heavenly Father,
we remember now his offering of himself
made once for all upon the cross;
we proclaim his mighty resurrection and glorious ascension;
we look for the coming of your kingdom,
and with this bread and this cup
we make the memorial of Christ your Son our Lord.

# All Christ has died: Christ is risen: Christ will come again.

Priest Accept through him, our great high priest,
this our sacrifice of thanks and praise,
and as we eat and drink these holy gifts
in the presence of your divine majesty,
renew us by your Spirit
inspire us with your love and unite us in the body of your Son,
Jesus Christ our Lord.

Through him, and with him, and in him, in the unity of the Holy Spirit, with all who stand before you in earth and heaven, we worship you, Father almighty, in words of everlasting praise:
