Lighting of the Advent Wreath

Before each of the Advent Candles is lit a prayer will be said. After each candle is lit we invite you to join in the prayers in bold.

The First Advent Candle:

A prayer is said and the first candle is lit

All: Lord Jesus, Light of the world, born in David's city of Bethlehem, born like him to be a king:

Be born in our hearts at Christmas, be king of our lives today. Amen.

The Second Advent Candle:

A prayer is said and the second candle is lit

All: Lord Jesus, Light of the world, the prophets said you would bring peace and save your people in trouble. Give peace in our hearts at Christmas and show all the world God's love. Amen

The Third Advent Candle:

A prayer is said and the third candle is lit

All: Lord Jesus, Light of the world,
John the Baptist told the people to prepare,

As Christmas grows closer day by day,
help us to be ready to welcome you now. Amen.

The Fourth Advent Candle:

A prayer is said and the fourth candle is lit

and bless us your children who long for your coming. Amen.

The Fifth Advent Candle:
