


We are now busy thinking about the Coronation, we are designing crowns and making bunting to celebrate the occasion. We will be celebrating by having a picnic on the field.

VILLAGE HISTORY BY MARGARET BUTT John Dowyer (Sculptor) and Giacomo Leoni (Architect)

In the De Grey mausoleum at Flitton church is the monument of Anthony, Earl Harrold, eldest son of the Duke of Kent. The Earl died in 1723 aged 28 apparently by choking on a grain of barley but Lady Amabel Yorke in her diary of 1817 says that the barley was 'uncertain and dubious' and implies he had a disease of the throat. The Earl had been Lord of the Bedchamber to The Prince of Wales, later George II. His tomb was designed by an Italian architect, Giacomo Leoni and the sculptor was John Dowyer.

When the Earl went on his Grand Tour of Italy, his father the Duke of Kent asked him to find a suitable architect to build a new house at Wrest as the old one was crumbling. In Italy the Earl met Leoni, a leading palladian architect of the time. Leoni was asked to draw up plans for an impressive new mansion. However, the De Greys lost a lot of money in the South Sea Bubble and their London home in St James Square burnt down so the new house was never built during the Duke's lifetime.



Leoni came to England and designed, amongst others, Lyme Park in Cheshire, the location of Pride and Prejudice [where Colin Firth dived into the lake]. John Dowyer, a lesser known London based sculptor, wood carver and furniture maker worked with Leoni for several years.

When the Earl of Harrold died, Leoni was asked to design the monument and Dowyer was the sculptor. It was completed in 1726. It's an unusual design with 3 toed claws [a reference to the wyvern on the De Grey crest] and a black sarcophagus base, very different to the other monuments. As was the fashion, the Earl is dressed in Roman clothes. The monument has been described as clumsy, the overlarge head not corresponding with the rest of the body and that Dowyer had failed to master the intracies of the design. It's surprising that the Duke let an unknown sculptor do the work to commemorate his beloved son but Dowyer must have been recommended by Leoni.

The Duke did not ask Leoni to design his own monument [possibly because he did not like the Harrold monument] but turned to Edward Shepherd who was overseeing the work on rebuilding at St James Square, his London home. The Duke also commissioned Rysbrack, a much more renowned sculptor, to carve the statues.

John Dowyer lived in Drury Lane near Covent Garden, home to many artists and artisans. His professional career is only known from 1725-1731. He also lived in Westminster and was buried there in 1741. He married Ann Godson in 1728. Leoni died in 1746 and is buried at Old St Pancras churchyard. Leoni did other designs for monuments but they were sculpted by Rysbrack.
